RED, BLUE AND PURPLE: 2022 MID-TERM ELECTIONS

Republicans have spent much of 2022 predicting a "Red Wave" in the first midterm election of the Biden presidency. Of late, however, Democrats have been buoyed by recovering poll numbers, particularly in key Senate races. Control of the upper chamber is now expected to be a fight to the finish, holding implications for, among other things, Biden nominees to the federal courts for the final two years of his term.

The current composition of the U.S. House of Representatives is 220 Democrats, 211 Republicans and four vacancies (218 is the magic number for control of the chamber). Projections for the 2022 mid-term election show the House flipping to Republican control.

The U.S. Senate will be more difficult than the House for Republicans to flip. The current composition includes 50 Republicans, 48 Democrats, and two Independents who caucus with the Democrats. Most analysts believe Democrats and Republicans can each count 46 seats in their column (43 seats locked up on each side, and three pick-ups on each side). The final eight seats are considered toss-ups.
