Legislators are scored in two parts: voting and pro-growth advocacy. Votes have been tallied in the same process historically used. Consideration of missed votes has been modified. Legislators missing more than 25 % of scored votes did not receive a grade due to insufficient evidence to demonstrate they are pro-growth. The Pro-Growth Advocate grade reflects what bills the legislator filed, co-authored, or carried in committee, debated for or against, and what types of questions they asked. # SCORED BILLS

<b>HB 2260</b>	Pro-Growth	Rep. Miller Sen. Haste	The rate of graduation of civil engineers is declining while the need for the profession has stayed the same. This tax incentive is a proven structure for growing an industry, as seen in the aerospace industry.
<b>HB 2298</b>	Pro-Growth	Rep. Hilbert Sen. Paxton	Rural access to health care can be dire in Oklahoma. HB 2298 allows certain advanced practicing nurses to have independent prescriptive authority.
<b>HB 2619</b>	Pro-Growth	Rep. Harris Sen. Howard	Third party litigation funding is a threat to all businesses. Everyone has a right to know who is behind a lawsuit. TPLF leads to nuclear verdicts, which can devastate a business.
<b>HB 2764</b>	Pro-Growth	Rep. T. Caldwell Sen. Hall	During the budget negotiations, the House, Senate, and Governor agreed to a quarter-point individual income tax cut and to eliminate two of the six brackets, making the brackets 2.5%, 3.5%, and 4.5%. The bill also directs the Board of Equalization to determine during its certification process if a further cut is fiscally allowable.
<b>HB 2781</b>	Pro-Growth	Rep. T. Caldwell Sen. Hall	Outlines the Reindustrialize Oklahoma Act (ROE-25), a rebate program for companies with the creation of 700 jobs and investment of \$2 billion.
<b>SB 95</b>	Pro-Growth	Sen. Seifried Rep. Archer	Non-classroom experiential learning opportunities for students are necessary for a student's later success. But clarification is needed on liability coverage. SB 95 clarifies that an unpaid student worker is not an employee and, therefore, not covered under workers' compensation, removing a barrier for businesses to create these programs.
<b>SB 224</b>	Pro-Growth	Sen. Seifried Rep. C. Caldwell	Tracking a student through their educational paths will help policymakers know what interventions were successful. This will allow Oklahoma to create actionable steps toward improvement and prepare a skilled workforce.
<b>SB 324</b>	Pro-Growth	Sen. Thompson Rep. Hill	When it comes to business environment, states generally compete in three areas: costs of production, productivity, and innovation. Oklahoma needs to increase its innovation ranking. Investments into Oklahoma's research and development, like the one proposed in SB 324, will allow Oklahoma to compete in this area.
<b>SB 642</b>	Pro-Growth	Sen. Paxton Rep. Hilbert	Protecting the right to contract, especially when there is an indemnity clause included, is paramount to a business' ability to freely operate without uncertainty of increased liability.
<b>SB 662</b>	Pro-Growth	Sen. Pugh Rep. Hill	The Workforce Commission is primed to be the state's lead agency on developing the workforce Oklahoma needs. It plans to do this by aligning all the workforce programs and tools available to meet industry demand.
